It was agreed that the group will try to produce a register of village residents who have a relevant skill and try to recruit these skill sets.

Sue agreed to look at the surveys currently awaiting agreement for other Parishes and the last Parish survey for Hook and circulate a suggested survey for agreement at the next meeting.

14.03 Agreement on the process for Terms of Reference.

Simon agreed to review terms of reference already agreed for another parish. Simon will circulate suggested Terms of Reference for agreement at the next meeting.

14.04 Designating the area.
